



PUBLIC NOTICE

2016 Submersed Aquatic Vegetation Control Program *Egeria Densa* and Curlyleaf Pondweed



California Department of Parks and Recreation Division of Boating and Waterways will be conducting herbicide treatments in parts of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta to control *Egeria densa* and Curlyleaf Pondweed.

The following information is subject to change based on governmental requirements, weather conditions, plant growth, waterway traffic, and other conditions.

Proposed Treatment Period

Starting March 10, 2016 through July 2016. Treatment period based upon DBW field survey data, water temperatures and fishery surveys.



Potential Treatment Areas*

In and/or around the following areas:

- **Anchorage, Boat Ramps and Marinas:** Brannan Island State Recreation Area, Cruise Haven, Ox Bow Marina, Owl Harbor, Buckley Cove and Delta Marina.
- **Near Old River:** Franks Tract (partial); Discovery Bay West; Holland Riverside; and Indian, Rock and Piper sloughs.
- **Stockton Area:** Hog Island (Power Squadron), Westlake, Tinsley Island (St. Francis Yacht Club) and Fourteen Mile Slough (including Village West Marina).
- **Sacramento Area:** Sycamore and Beaver sloughs.

*Individual areas will be noticed prior to treatment application. If all listed sites are treated, acreage will total 2,273 acres.



Herbicides Being Applied

Fluridone - Registered for aquatic use with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and California Department of Pesticide Regulation.

Precautions

The public should not gather on or near boat docks during treatment applications. Boaters, swimmers, fisherman, and other recreationists in an area being immediately treated are urged to heed any directives aimed at protecting public safety offered by herbicide applicators.

Monitoring

Treated areas will be monitored weekly to ensure herbicide levels do not exceed allowable limits, or have any significant adverse impacts on the environment, agriculture, or public health in or near the above mentioned treatment areas.
